The issue for considering re-medical examination for the in-service employees of Safety Category who had been declared unfit due to Diabetes Mellitus prior to issue of Board's letter dated 03.05.2011 was discussed in detail.

Official Side brought out that diabetes being a progressive illness, cannot be compared with other kind of illness which can be completely cured, and as such, were not in favour of reviewing the old cases. However, on the insistence of the Staff Side who pointed out that the number of such cases would not be very large and that by providing opportunity to the staff for facing re-medical examination safety is not being compromised as their fitness or otherwise shall be decided by the Medical Board, it was agreed to review. However, Safety directorate had not agreed to the proposal.
