

Record Note of Discussions held by DG/RHS with the Staff Side on 26.07.2012 on DC/JCM Item No.25/2009: Pre-medical Examination- Relaxation for Loco Pilots declared with Type II Diabetes and DC/JCM Item No.14/2010: Medical facilities to the staff working at the road side stations and ganghuts.

Item No.25/2009: Pre-medical Examination- Relaxation for Loco Pilots declared with Type-II Diabetes.


This item could not be discussed as Adv.(Safety) was not available. It was agreed that further discussion on this issue will be held in the Chamber of Adv.(Safety) at an early date.

Item No.14/2010: Medical facilities to the staff working at the road side stations and ganghuts.

To address the problem of the staff working at road side stations and ganghuts, it was agreed that :-

- (i) The implementation of road mobile medical van will be followed up and in case the Zonal Railways have any difficulty in implementation that will be separately dealt with.
- (ii) The possibility of deputing Line Doctors to such road side stations and ganghuts will be explored and the extant provisions regarding medical facilities to the staff stationed at remote places will be given a fresh look.
- (iii) Engagement of CMP doctors from 8 years to 10 years will be examined.
- (iv) For treatment in an emergency, orders already exists vide Board's letter No.2005/H/6-4/ Policy-II dated 31.01.2007 and (ii) 2009/H/6-4/Policy/4 dated 26.10.2009 which will be reiterated.
- (v) Possibility of any other scheme will also be explored.

Further, staff side pointed out that the employees working at remote places where Railway Medical facilities are not available when they avail treatment from the private doctor, expenses incurred and such claims not being reimbursed and such claims are rejected. After discussion, it was decided to look into the matter.
